Introduction & Contents

Welcome to the real New Zealand. A New Zealand free of traffic, free of queues, free of noise, hustle, bustle and jostling visitors. Welcome to Southland and Fiordland.

This is a region of contrasts. The lush plains of central Southland are flanked by the rolling hills of the Catlins to the east, the soaring jagged peaks of Fiordland to the west and the primordial forests of Stewart Island to the south. Northern Southland's meandering rivers are offset both by the turbulent seas of the Foveaux Strait and by the mysterious depths of the glacier-carved fiords. Visitors come to the region for days and wish they could stay for years.

Such a diverse landscape offers a multitude of activities. Fiordland is justly famous as one of the world's finest walking destinations; however visitors can also explore New Zealand's largest National Park - and its environs - by jet boat, quad bike, horseback, kayak, helicopter, fixed wing or float plane. Southland is steeped in Maori and early settler history and many of the region's towns have a museum dedicated to times gone by. Farming is now one of the region's primary industries, with many stations (farms) offering homestays or tours which give a true flavour of life in a rural community.

One of the best ways to explore Southland and Fiordland is to drive the Southern Scenic Route (SSR). This iconic road trip stretches between Queenstown, Invercargill and Dunedin, taking in the length of NZ's southern coastline and offering some of the best scenery in the world. Make time to explore the small towns en route and you will be rewarded with a huge variety of fantastic cafes, quirky shops, and off-the-beaten track activities. Mid-way on the SSR is

Invercargill, NZ's most southerly city and one of the southernmost cities in the world. Make time in your schedule to meet Henry the tuatara at Invercargill's Southland Museum and Art Gallery. Tuatara are reptiles endemic to NZ and Henry is said to be over 110 years old!

Not on the Southern Scenic Route, but well worth a side-trip, is the bustling town of Gore - famous for brown trout, country music and Hokonui Moonshine.

Surrounded on all sides by sea, Southland/Fiordland is justly famous for its pristine sandy beaches - and its seafood. Blue cod, crayfish (lobster), paua and the world famous Bluff oyster are just some of the region's fare well worth trying, while Fiordland venison and Southland lamb and beef are celebrated throughout New Zealand for flavour and quality. Somewhat less glamorous, though no less tasty, is the ubiquitous Southland Sushi, or cheese roll: one bite and you'll be hooked!

The unique character of this region is driven by water - the seas that encircle it, the rivers that run through it, and the rain that falls on it. Lying between latitudes 44° and 47°, Southland and Fiordland sit squarely in the 'Roaring Forties'. You may well need a raincoat when here, but the splendour of watching a Fiordland river in flood, or the Southern seas break across Stewart Island, is well worth it. This is also the last place in New Zealand to catch the setting sun so your journey will be accompanied by long summer days and spectacular sunsets.

'Southern hospitality' is taken very seriously down here. You will be welcomed as a friend and will depart a local. Enjoy your time in our part of New Zealand and be sure to come again soon.

Invercargill, The Friendly City and the most southernmost city in New Zealand is the province's commercial heart.

With a population of 53,000, Invercargill is recognised for its hospitality to visitors and as the gateway to some of New Zealand's most beautiful scenery.

Invercargill's wide streets with minimal traffic, spacious parks and gardens, striking Victorian and Edwardian architecture, along with huge beaches in close proximity are made more impressive by the endless blue skies and long sunsets.

For the visitor, Invercargill offers excellent shopping with a broad selection of restaurants and bars, café culture, along with lively arts and events throughout the year.

Southland Museum and Art Gallery on the edge of Queens Park is the province's principal heritage organisation, exhibiting natural, human history and art of the region, changing national and international art exhibitions and tuatara as part of New Zealand's most successful capture breeding programme of the species.

Experience the Subantarctic Islands in the dedicated Roaring 40s gallery and connect with tangata whenua of the region through the Maori galleries.

Queens Park in the centre of the city with over 80 hectares of park with playgrounds, animal enclosures, bird aviary and golf course (one of four in the city) allows visitors the opportunity to meet the locals at their own pace.

Anderson Park, a handsome Georgian style residence built in 1924 and set in 24 hectares of extensively landscaped lawns and gardens, contains an impressive selection of quality New Zealand art.

Each year it conducts an annual spring exhibition of works from all over New Zealand, from which it purchase work for its permanent collection. Open daily with guided tours by arrangement.

Southland is renowned for its sporting prowess and the city is blessed with first class facilities and venues.

Splash Palace is an all weather facility providing an aquatic playground for all ages; swimming pools, waterslide, leisure wave and swirl pools and diving boards provide hours of enjoyment.

The city boasts New Zealand's only indoor cycling velodrome at Stadium Southland, hosting national and international events; you can even hire a bike yourself and do a few circuits if you feel so inclined



And just at the edge of the city is Oreti Beach, a favourite with the locals

for swimming and walking along with families. More recently Oreti Beach has become synonymous with a local hero, the late Burt Munro who set a world speed record with his Indian motorbike. The same bike can be viewed at E Hayes & Sons hardware store in Tay Street, a must see for any man with a love of motorbikes.






Southern Scenic Route

The Southern Scenic Route, covering 610 km, begins or ends in Dunedin city and travels through Balclutha and The Catlins area to Invercargill city before taking in Riverton, Colac Bay, Tuatapere and the gateways to Fiordland: Manapouri and Te Anau before ending in Queenstown.

This scenic travelling route guides you through some of the most spectacular coastal scenery and rural settings in New Zealand. The journey features contrasting beauty of unique landscapes, from rolling green pastures and native New Zealand forest, to the wild southern coastline and looming mountains.

Bluff, established in 1824, is the oldest European town in New Zealand. Located 30kms south of Invercargill, the Port of Bluff provides a vital link between the provincial hinterland and overseas markets. Petroleum, agri nutrients, alumina, coke and fish are imported while dairy, meat, fish, woodchips, sawn timber and aluminium are among the products exported. South Port operates the port and has key shipping links throughout Asia, Australia and North America.

At Stirling Point, named after William Stirling who cultivated the land to service whaling bases, visit the international signpost marking the start of State Highway 1 and take a walk through native forest to awesome views of Stewart Island and Foveaux Strait.

The Bluff Maritime Museum with its extensive collection of models, boats, displays & photographs gives an insight and understanding of the rich maritime history of the district.

The museum also acts as an information centre for the area so please make a point of calling in, they will make you welcome.

The summit of Bluff Hill (Motupohue) enables a panorama of Southland's mountains, plains and estuaries as well as Stewart Island to be viewed.

Taste some world-famous Bluff oysters, a much sought after seasonal delicacy, which were first commercially caught in the late 1870s. Bluff also processes lobster, blue cod and green lip mussels caught around Stewart Island and in Foveaux Strait.

Take a scenic bush drive at Omaui, where great picnic spots and beach walks abound.

And don't forget to take some souvenir photos at the famous Stirling Point signpost.

Bluff is also the gateway to Stewart Island, where a regular catamaran service is available from Bluff Harbour.

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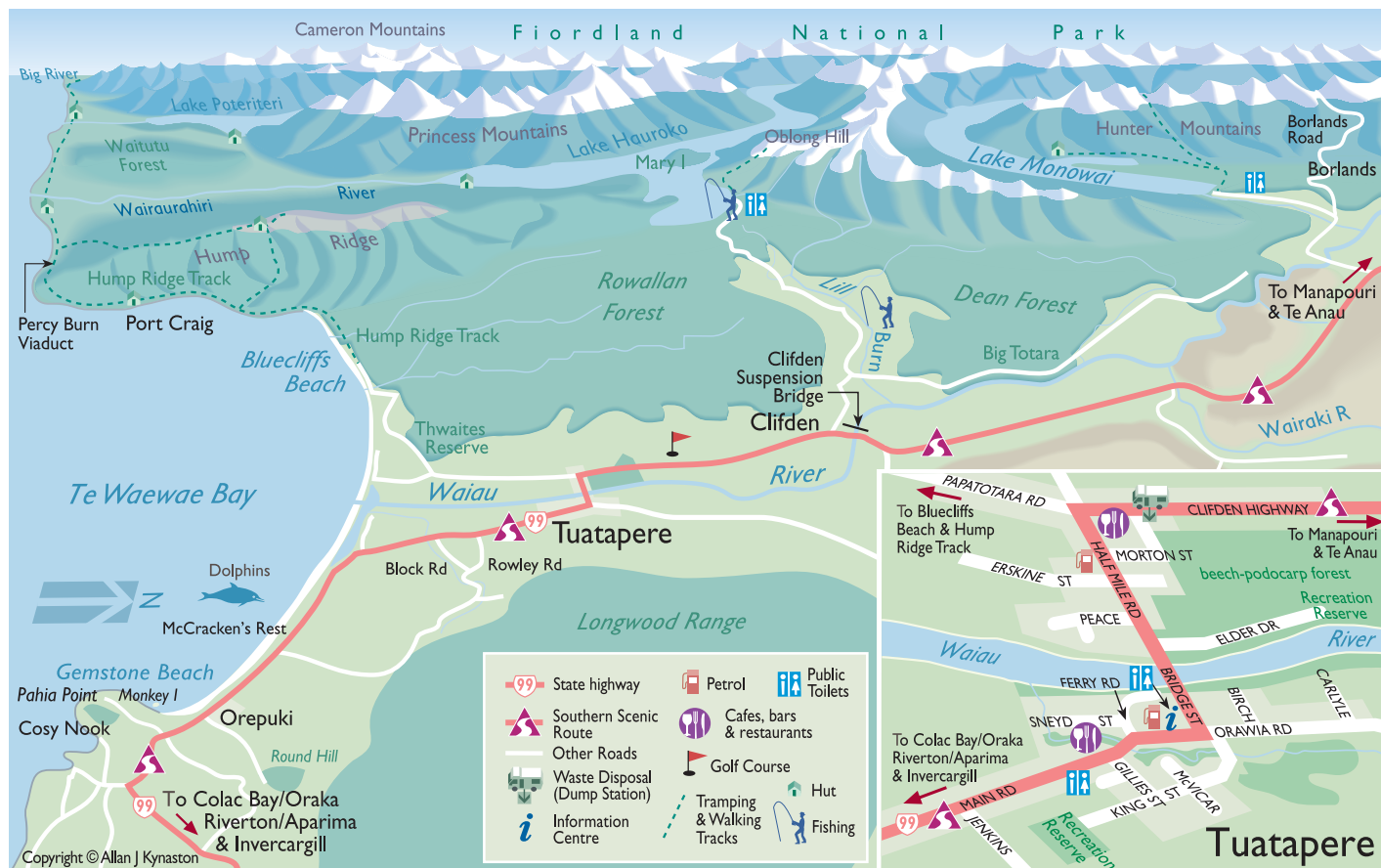
Tuatapere

Tuatapere area has a direct link to New Zealand's early European history. Captain Cook first visited Southern Fiordland in 1770 where he encountered a number of Maori during a visit to Dusky Sound. Maori have occupied the south of the South Island for approximately 1000 years and had established permanent settlements at Riverton/Apirima and Colac Bay/Oraka.

From around 1809 the area was active with whalers and sealers; originally named Papatotara, the town was renamed Tuatapere in 1904.

Tuatapere is located on the banks of the Waiau River on the Southern Scenic Route midway between Te Anau (98km) and Invercargill (88km). There is a wide selection of things to see and do, beaches, lakes, historic sites, bush walks and a World Heritage area. Orepuki Gemstone Beach, Port Craig Viaducts, Clifden suspension bridge, Limestone caves, hunting, fishing, tramping and jetboating. The Bushman's Museum provides a comprehensive photographic record of early milling operations and a static display of milling equipment.

The Hump Ridge Track overlooking Te Waewae Bay (Bluecliffs Beach, where Hector's dolphins and Southern Right whales are sometimes to be seen), is a 3 day/2 night circuit offering spectacular views over the South coast and inland lakes. And as a treat, indulge yourself in a hearty meal of the "World Famous" Tuatapere sausages.

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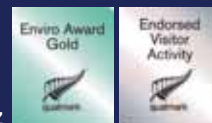

Introduction to Fiordland

Fiordland - one of the world's last great wildernesses and the essence of New Zealand's untamed splendor. Imagine standing high in the mountains, looking over a vast landscape of soaring peaks, glistening fiords, and mighty rivers winding through native forest. Fiordland is a 'must see' for anyone travelling to New Zealand.

Renowned as the home of Mitre Peak and the awe-inspiring fiords of Milford Sound and Doubtful Sound, Fiordland has achieved UNESCO World Heritage status. Numerous short walks and multi-day hiking trails, including three of the New Zealand Great Walks (the Milford, Routeburn, and Kepler Tracks), have earned Fiordland the reputation of one of the world's finest walking destinations. Combine your walk with a scenic flight, a jet boat ride, a horse trek or a quad-bike trip and you have an adventure of a lifetime.

The attractive lakeside town of Te Anau, located on the shores of the South Island's largest lake, is the gateway to Fiordland and provides a perfect base to explore the area. Here you can enjoy a range of activities on or off the water, fine restaurants, seven-days-a-week shopping and a large range of accommodation options.

From Te Anau it is 2 1/2 hour drive through some of the most beautiful South Island scenery to Milford Sound or 20 minutes by road to the most picturesque lake in the world, Lake Manapouri, and the start of a Doubtful Sound excursion.

Weather - Climate

Fiordland's unique character is a result of the enormous natural power of water. Glaciers created the rugged landscape by carving out the sheer faces of the fiords and gouging valley floors to form lakes. Water remains a main element of the beauty of the area - lakes, rivers, streams, waterfalls, lush rainforest and stunning fiords. Fiordland often looks its best after a heavy downpour and it is recommended to bring sensible clothing for cool and wet weather to fully appreciate your stay. In summer, Fiordland's temperatures can soar, so sun-cream is a must as the region's clear air means the sun can be severe and burn time is short.

Getting To, From & Around Fiordland

Self drive

Access to Te Anau is via State Highways 6 & 94 from Queenstown, State Highways 1 & 94 from Dunedin, or via Invercargill and the Southern Scenic Route. It should be noted that the highways travel through diverse terrain and spectacular scenery that should not be rushed.

Often travellers do not allow enough time for the drive to Te Anau, and do not realise that Milford Sound is a further 2 1/2 hours from Te Anau, so if you are planning your journey be sure to allow enough time to enjoy it.



Road conditions

All State Highways into Te Anau are fully sealed and well maintained. The Milford Road is a spectacular alpine corridor which requires care and concentration when self-driving. For up to date nationwide and local road events phone Transit New Zealand's road report FP: 0800 444 449.

Te Anau Airport - Manapouri is located 17 kilometres from Te Anau and accepts charter flights by helicopter and fixed wing aircraft.

Fiordland's History

This area was well known to the Maori and many legends pertain to its formation and naming. The Demi-god Tu-te-raki-whanoa is said to have carved out the fiords with his adze Te Hamo. Few Maori were permanent residents of the region but seasonal foodgathering camps were linked by well-worn trails. Captain Cook and his crew were the first Europeans to visit Fiordland and in 1773 spent five weeks in Dusky Sound. Cook's maps and descriptions soon attracted sealers and whalers who formed the first European settlements of New Zealand. From the middle of the 19th century surveyors, explorers and prospectors began to penetrate the unexplored interior of Fiordland.

Fiordland National Park

'A cherished corner of the world where mountains and valleys compete with each other for room, where scale is almost beyond comprehension, rainfall is measured in metres and scenery encompasses the broadest width of emotions' This is how the author of the book "Mountains of Water - The Story of Fiordland National Park" described this stunning National Park. The largest National Park in New Zealand, covering over 1.2 million hectares, Fiordland National Park is administered by the Department of Conservation. A 500 kilometre network of walking tracks and over 60 huts allows the public to explore the primeval world of mountain peaks, alpine lakes and moss-carpeted valleys. DOC also runs endangered species programmes and conservation projects in Fiordland.

Te Wahipounamu World Heritage Area

The extraordinary beauty of Fiordland was recognised by the United Nations in 1986 when it was made a World Heritage Area. The Fiordland National Park was described as having 'superlative natural phenomena' and 'outstanding examples of the earth's evolutionary history'.

In 1990 the Te Wahipounamu World Heritage Area was extended to include Fiordland, Westland and Mt Cook National Parks. It now covers 10 percent of New Zealand's land mass.



Te Anau and Manapouri are both lakeside townships and the main settlement areas within Fiordland. Both towns provide a relaxed atmosphere and a fantastic base to explore the National Park and fiords.

Te Anau

Lake Te Anau is the largest lake in the South Island. The attractive town of Te Anau lies nestled on its shore, with a spectacular backdrop of Mt Luxmore and the Murchison mountains.

Te Anau provides a full range of services to visitors, and is the closest town to Milford Sound - a scenic 2 ½ hour drive away. A wide range of accommodation is available while local cafes and restaurants provide a variety of dining options, from fish & chips to fine dining, and the opportunity to sample local specialities of venison and lobster. There are plenty of activities ensuring visitors can find things to do while enjoying the relaxed atmosphere and picturesque surroundings.

The international reputation as the 'walking capital of the world' is well earned, with Te Anau being the departure point for many excellent walking tracks. Coach and boat transfers are available to all major tracks, including the Great Walks: the Milford, Routeburn and Kepler Tracks.

Families can enjoy a walk along the lakeshore to the Wildlife Park to view the extremely rare Takahe (endemic to Fiordland) as well as many other native birds, or can visit Ivon Wilson Park - ideal for a picnic lunch.

Manapouri

Only 20 minutes drive from Te Anau, Manapouri is framed by the Cathedral and Hunter mountain ranges. The township is situated on the shores of the lake and is a popular stop on the Southern Scenic Route. Manapouri is also the gateway to the scenic wonders of Doubtful and Dusky Sound, and is the starting point for many walking tracks and kayaking, fishing and hunting excursions. There are few lakes more mysterious than Lake Manapouri: brooding, tranquil, tempestuous, serene, glowering, amazing – all are words that have been used to describe the lake in one of its compelling moods.

Journeys to Doubtful Sound depart from Pearl Harbour in Manapouri and cross the lake to West Arm. This excursion includes an optional visit to the West Arm underground power station.

The Manapouri township offers a growing range of accommodation including B&B, motel, backpackers and camping grounds. Services available in Manapouri include a cafe, dairy, restaurant and service station.



Sounds or Fiords?

Fiordland's west coast is deeply indented by 14 fiords spanning 215 kilometres of coastline. The steep mountains rise up from the ocean making for a spectacular sight. Early Europeans exploring the southern coastline bestowed the names of Sounds onto these dramatic valleys, however a true 'sound' is a river valley that has been flooded due to the land sinking below sea level. Fiords are created by glacial action that produces u-shaped valleys with steep cliffs. The mistake can be understood when you realise that many of these early sailors were of English and Welsh extraction and were not familiar with fiords. The mistake survives in the names of the famous Sounds, but the region was renamed Fiordland to recognise the true nature of these rugged inlets.

Milford Sound

According to Maori legend, Tu-te-raki-whanoa carved out the fiords with his adze Te Hamo. He started in the far south where he created a rough coastline with many islands.

By the time he reached Milford Sound he had perfected his technique and carved an awe-inspiring fiord.

Piopiota (Milford Sound) was his greatest achievement. The goddess of the underworld, Hine-nui-te-po, came to see the handiwork of Tu and was so alarmed at the beauty of Piopiota, that she worried that once people had seen the fiord they would not want to leave its beauty. To encourage humans to leave the area she released the sandfly into Milford Sound!

Wet or fine Milford Sound is an awesome sight. Sheer granite cliffs tower into the sky and plunge into the depths of clear water, while Mitre Peak stands like a massive sentinel, guarding this amazing fiord. Milford is the best known of the fiords, and the only one that can be reached by road. Cruises run daily and overnight packages are also available. Spectacular kayaking and diving trips are very popular in the fiord along with the opportunity to visit the Underwater Observatory.

The overnight boats and Milford Sound Lodge are the only options for accommodation within Milford, and visitors need to book well in advance for either of these. Lunch options are available on most cruises but must be pre-booked, and the Blue Duck Cafe & Restaurant at Milford Sound Lodge also provide dining options.

Doubtful Sound

Doubtful Sound is a haven of nature with ancient rainforest, abundant wildlife and superb physical grandeur.

Practically untouched by man, the fiord has a deep stillness, a sense of solitude and serenity - it is quite simply and unquestionably breathtaking.

Doubtful Sound is the larger and deeper of the two fiords. New Zealand fur seals and Fiordland crested penguins can be seen on many of the small islets in the entrance to the fiord, while bottlenose dolphins can often be sighted as they swim alongside the boats. Several outstanding waterfalls adorn the rich bush clad walls.

The trip to Doubtful Sound starts with a boat trip across beautiful Lake Manapouri, followed by a bus journey over the rugged Wilmot Pass. A trip to the underground power station at West Arm to view the massive turbines inside the mountain cavern makes an interesting side trip.



Fiordland Activities

A growing range of activities ensure visitors can find plenty of things to do, whether they are seeking to enjoy the scenic grandeur of lakes, mountains or fiords, on a short walk or sightseeing excursion or something more challenging like a multi-day hike or hunting Wapiti amidst the untamed forest. Farm expeditions provide a slice of New Zealand farm life. Horse treks, 4WD quad bikes, jet boat rides and scenic flight trips by helicopter, fixed wing or float plane allow visitors to explore mixed terrain and outstanding vistas of the rivers, lakes, farmland and mountains. A visit to the Underwater Observatory or a guided diving experience allows access to sights rarely revealed to human visitors.

Boat trips provide a means to explore the beautiful waters of the fiords, lakes and rivers, and give excellent fishing opportunities. Knowledgeable local guides can unlock the secrets of the region to you, or perhaps you might like to spend time in Te Anau or Manapouri just relaxing.

The Milford Road

The Milford Road isn't just a journey - it's a destination in itself!

Leaving Te Anau and heading north, visitors follow 119 kilometres of sealed road to majestic Milford Sound. The road is a stunning alpine drive, and visitors should make time to stop and appreciate the sheer scale of the landscape and the numerous short walks that can be enjoyed along the way.

IMPORTANT MILFORD ROAD INFORMATION

Despite its remote location many people travel along the Milford Road each year, particularly in the summer months (October to April). Drivers need to be aware that they will be sharing the road with cars, coaches, campervans and minibuses. Plan your trip! The journey from Te Anau to Milford Sound takes a minimum of 2 1/2 hours driving, without allowing for stops at scenic points and walkways: allow plenty of time to meet your cruise departure without rushing. Drivers also need to bear in mind that delays can occur at the Homer Tunnel and other areas along the highway. Ask at information centres or your accommodation about planning the journey to avoid congestion.

There are no fuel stops or stations between Te Anau and Milford, and at 240 kilometres (or 144 miles) return you need to ensure you have sufficient fuel before leaving Te Anau.

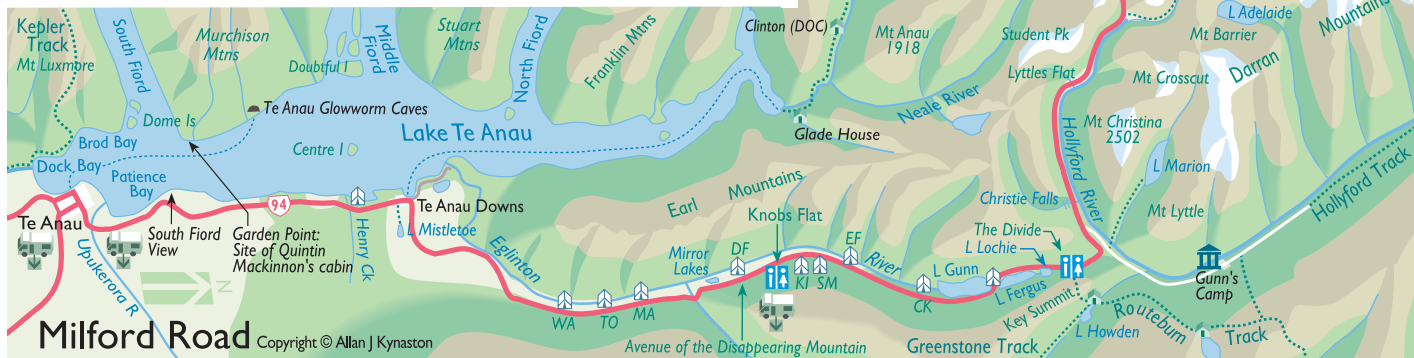
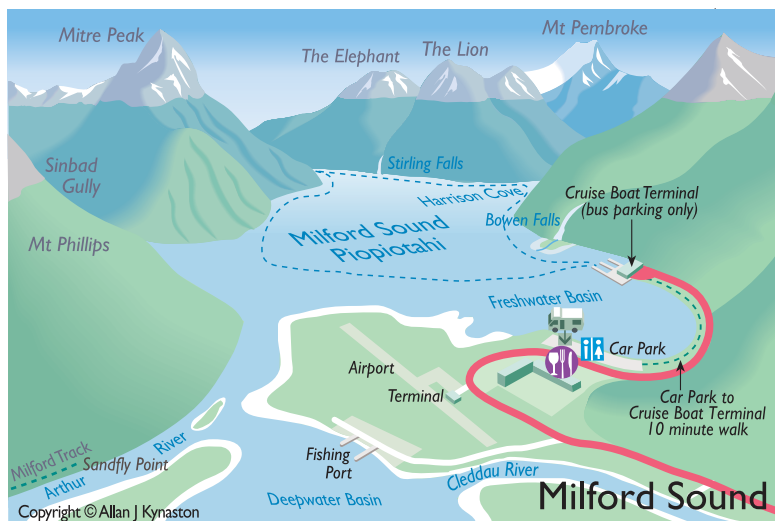
If you are at all concerned about driving the Milford Road there are four options that allow you to view the scenery without the hassle of driving. The majority also offer an excellent commentary about local sites and history, with short stops along the way.

WINTER ROAD CONDITIONS

Fiordland's steep mountain ranges create a challenging and demanding terrain. The large snow catchments and steep sided valleys sometimes create avalanche conditions. The Milford Road is constantly monitored during avalanche season and the road is closed if avalanches are likely. Between May and November all vehicles on the Milford Road must carry car snow chains at all times. This is a legal requirement to ensure safety on the road. The Homer Tunnel

Completed in 1953, the Homer Tunnel (1.2km) pierces the sheer rock to allow road access to Milford Sound. At an altitude of 945 metres above sea level the tunnel is an extraordinary achievement and has remained largely unmodified since its early creation. There is limited internal lighting within the tunnel. Traffic lights control traffic flows over peak periods in the summer months. Outside of peak times drivers should be aware that the tunnel has two narrow sections with a passing bay at either end for larger vehicles.



Walking In Fiordland

Fiordland earned its reputation as the 'walking capital of the world' with the many excellent walking tracks that traverse its dramatic landscape. Coach and boat transfers access the major tracks, including the Great Walks: the Milford, Routeburn and Kepler Tracks.

These tracks offer a sense of freedom and escape seldom found in the world today.

Known to New Zealanders as 'tramping' the endless hiking and walking opportunities on other tracks within Fiordland National Park, such as the Tuatapere Hump Ridge Track and Dusky Tracks, can be explored independently or as part of a guided group.

The townships of Te Anau and Manapouri are convenient bases to access any of the walking tracks within Fiordland National Park. Walkers can stock up on provisions in Te Anau, and check the weather and track conditions before leaving.

Sports shops and outdoor clothing stores in Te Anau have equipment to rent or buy. With the track complete, visitors relish returning to Manapouri or Te Anau for a hearty meal in the warmth and comfort of a local café or bar.

Families can enjoy a walk along the Te Anau lakeshore to the Wildlife Park to view the extremely rare Takahe (endemic to Fiordland) as well as many other native birds, or can visit Ivon Wilson Park – ideal for a picnic lunch.

Keep Safe in the Hills!

The Fiordland National Park is a mountainous area and can experience rapid changes in the weather. It is important to always be prepared with appropriate clothing and equipment and to check forecasts before you leave. If undertaking multi-day hiking trails an emergency locator beacon is a must and can be hired from a range of outlets in Te Anau & Manapouri.

Choose a trip suitable for your skills, knowledge and experience – be realistic, if you're not an experienced outdoors person, it is recommended you book a guided walk. For up-to-date information visit www.doc.govt.nz.

It is also important to keep your possessions safe when you are enjoying the National Park. While we are lucky to enjoy relatively low crime rates this is never guaranteed. A range of transport operators offer shuttle connections to and from the tracks meaning there are plenty of options should you wish to leave your vehicle safely in Te Anau.

Short Walks

Te Anau, Manapouri and the Milford Road have numerous short walks from 30 minutes to half or full day walking excursions, all offering different attractions and scenery. These walks enable access to the rainforest, lake and alpine vistas for those with limited time or fitness. Further information is available from the Fiordland National Park Visitors Centre, Lakefront Drive, Te Anau or visit www.doc.govt.nz.

Major Walking Tracks

Known to New Zealanders as 'tramping', the endless hiking and walking opportunities within Fiordland National Park can be explored independently, or with a touch of luxury as part of a guided group.

Listed below are the multi-day tracks in Fiordland which are available to explore independently. A indication of fitness levels is also given.

Milford Track guided/great walk

Moderate to high

This 53.5km walk follows several glaciated valleys, ascends an alpine pass and traverses some of the finest scenery in the world. The walk takes 4 to 5 days and involves boat travel at both ends. Recommend to book well in advance.

Routeburn Track guided/great walk

Moderate to high

Stretching from the Divide, between eastern and western sides of the Southern Alps, the Routeburn Track is 32km long and starts or finishes in beech forests some 80km by road from Queenstown. Dramatic alpine views, lakes and changing forest types can be experienced over the summer season on this 3 to 4 day walk.

Kepler Track great walk

Moderate to high

60km walk starting and finishing at Lake Te Anau. Features lake edges, mountain beech forest, exposed mountaintops and glacial valleys along with excellent views of the Southern Alps. A 3 to 4 day trip.

Hollyford Track guided/independent

Moderate to high

This 56km track along the Hollyford Valley leads from the sheer rock walls of the Darren Mountains down to the sand dunes of the Tasman Sea at Martins Bay. Experience the relative isolation of the Fiordland bush, the bustling energy of the Hollyford River and the sand and windswept beauty of Martins Bay.

Tuatapere Hump Ridge Track guided/independent

Moderate to high

Situated in the southwest of Fiordland, this 55km circuit track was opened in 2001. The track covers a wide range of scenery from coastline to sub-alpine and includes the recently restored Percy Burn Viaduct. The track is rich in both Maori and European cultural history.

Moderate to high level of fitness required

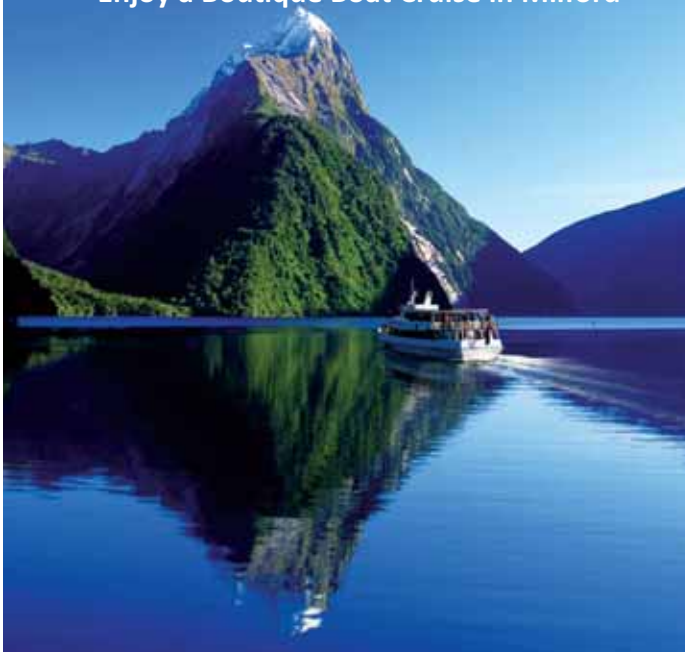

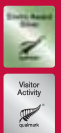

The numbers initially multiplied so rapidly that they quickly became a threat to the environment in the area, and organised hunting operations were initiated in an attempt to reduce numbers. Recreational hunting has remained popular in the Fiordland area. Anyone wishing to undertake hunting within the National Park must obtain a permit from the Department of Conservation.

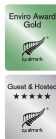

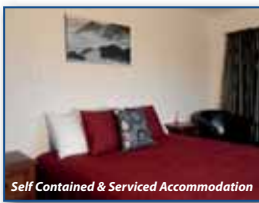

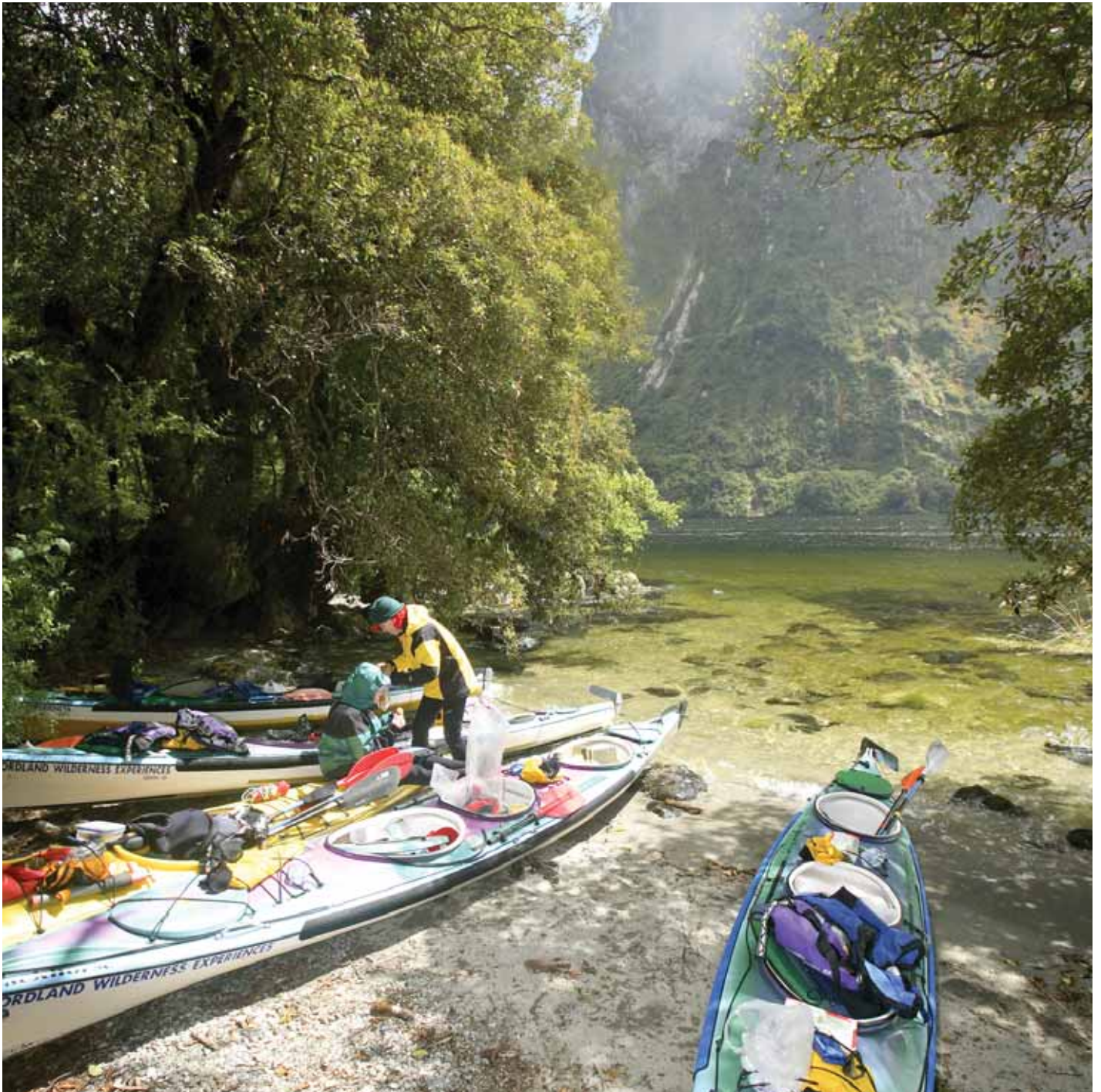

Northern Southland/Kingston

The Upper Mataura area in Northern Southland officially starts at Kingston at the southern end of Lake Wakatipu from Queenstown. It includes the villages of Kingston, Garston and Athol, ending with a great view from the lookout on the Jollies Pass above Five Rivers.

These small settlements were built along an historic railway line which was home to the vintage steam train, the Kingston Flyer, now operating train rides from Kingston. Amongst other things they provide the passing travellers with a variety of refreshments and accommodation. There is a new cycle trail about to be formed through the Upper Mataura area providing a new way to explore this area.

The landscape is a long valley surrounded by mountains from the ice age forming some stunning scenery, with the high mountains on the western side forming part of the Eyre Mountain Wilderness Park.

The Mataura River meandours all the way through it until it turns left at the Nokomai Gorge, before passing through Gore on its way to the Pacific ocean .It is popular with fly fishermen from all over the world who come to challenge its stock of brown trout in the Eyre and Mataura rivers.

Today the fertile hills and flats are farmed mainly by sheep and cattle farmers.

Activities and Attractions: Fly fishing (guides available), Kingston Flyer (steam train), farm stays, helicopter tours, horse trekking, walks and hikes.

Fishing in the South

The pursuit of trout in New Zealand is viewed as a national birthright. Anyone with a valid angler's licence may fish New Zealand lakes and rivers. New Zealand is fortunate that all its natural lakes and most of its rivers and streams have public access along their margins. To gain access across private land requires the landowner's consent; generally this is not withheld, however, anglers as a courtesy and to avoid misunderstanding, should first obtain permission. Once on the water, the angler is free to roam countless miles in search of trout and adventure, free of charge and without hindrance.



With water so pure that it is often described as 'gin clear', easy public access and plentiful fish, the region is an anglers paradise.

Southern rivers have long provided wonderful trout fishing not only for local anglers but also for the many visitors from around New Zealand and overseas. They travel to our region to test their skill in some of the best brown trout fisheries in the world and to fish for rainbow trout in the spectacular mountain streams. Our region abounds with numerous quality fishing rivers, streams and lakes. In fact, from Invercargill city, there are 27 excellent fishing rivers and streams within 2 hours easy driving. From Gore, The World Capital of Brown Trout Fishing, it is only an hour's drive to these fishing spots. The Mataura river is arguably the best flyfishing river in the world.

There are numerous unique features that differentiate our freshwater fishing from the other fishing regions within New Zealand. These include: Seclusion and tranquility, natural surroundings, easy and good access to clean, clear water; wild trout hatchery (rather than farmed trout), large numbers of trout in good condition with low density of anglers and a high probability of catch; a wide choice of fishing experiences in a small geographical area and a range of challenges from beginner to advanced level. A selection of fishing techniques can be used. All these favourable factors lead to memorable fishing experiences.

Rainbow trout can be fished for in the rivers and lakes of the Southern Lakes area but it is the quality of brown trout fishing which gives the South its deserved world-wide reputation as one of New Zealand's premier fishing destinations. Many respected anglers have suggested that anyone can catch a Rainbow trout but it takes real experience to land a Brown trout, as they are a particularly wily fish and provide a real challenge.

Some of the best salmon angling waters in New Zealand are found in Southland and each year visitors as well as locals take advantage of the many angling opportunities

the region has to offer. From the mighty Clutha in South Otago, to Lakes Te Anau and Manapouri, salmon can be found.

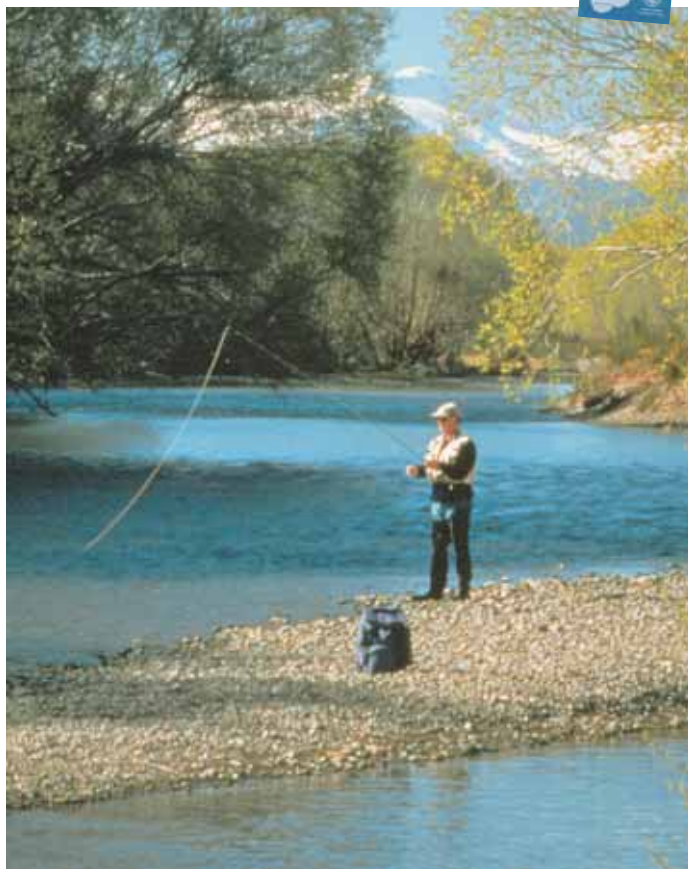
